

ERIC E. WOHLFORTH BIOGRAPHY

Eric E. Wohlforth has been Chair of the University of Alaska Foundation Investment Committee since 2004.

He served on the Board of Trustees of the Alaska Permanent Fund Corporation from January, 1995 until November, 2006. During that period he was elected twice as Vice Chair and Chair.

Mr. Wohlforth is founding member of the law firm of Wohlforth, Johnson, Brecht, Cartledge & Brooking (and predecessors), the first Alaska based public finance law firm which started in 1966.

Appointed Commissioner of Revenue for the State of Alaska by Governor William A. Egan from 1970 to 1972, Mr. Wohlforth was in charge of investing \$900 million in State receipts from oil lease sales.

He is a trustee of Alaska Pacific University and the University of Alaska Foundation and a board member of Commonwealth North. He is a Director of Alaska Growth Capital.

He has an undergraduate degree (A.B.) from Princeton University (1954), law degree from the University of Virginia (1957), a Master of Religious Education degree from Loyola University, New Orleans (1990), a Master of Arts, Organizational Development degree, Fielding Graduate Institute (2000), and is a current University of Alaska, Anchorage candidate for a Master's degree in Philosophy and English.

He has been Chancellor of the Episcopal Diocese of Alaska since 1972.
